

EMERGENCY CARE FOR LEG WOUNDS



1. Start with a clean, dry wound and leg.



2. Apply the dressing to the wound.



3. Wrap gauze in a spiral pattern down the leg (from front to back, outside to inside).



4. Wrap gauze in a spiral pattern up the leg (from front to back, outside to inside).



5. Apply padding so it is flat and wrinkle-free.



6. Use adhesive wrap in a spiral pattern down the leg.



7. Use adhesive wrap in a spiral pattern up the leg.



8. Use smooth, uniform pressure. Avoid lumps or ridges.

NOTE: Moderate pressure should be used while bandaging to avoid overtightening, which can injure the horse's tendons.
