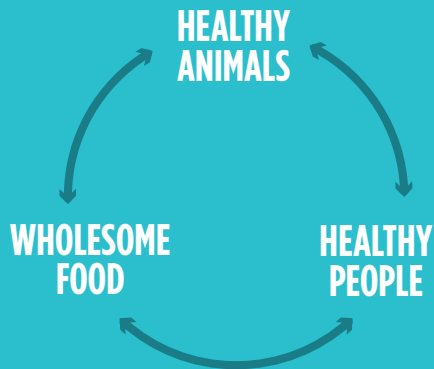


ZOETIS COMMITMENT TO RESPONSIBLE ANTIBIOTIC USE

WORKING TOGETHER TO PROTECT ANIMALS, THE FOOD SUPPLY AND, THROUGH SUSTAINED STEWARDSHIP, THE EFFICACY OF ANTIBIOTICS.



At Zoetis, we recognize that many actions are critical to ensuring our farm animals stay healthy, our food supply remains wholesome and that animal care practices on the farm do not pose a significant risk to human health.

At the beginning of the farm-to-fork production of meat, milk and other edible products, we believe that vigilance in farm animal nutrition, vaccination programs and biosecurity measures, coupled with oversight by veterinarians and educated animal caregivers, are all key factors in maintaining herd and flock health that lead to wholesome food.

However, when animals do get sick and need antibiotics, it is in all of our best interests — including Zoetis' — that these medications are used carefully, with the involvement of a veterinarian, so that they remain effective now and in years to come. Here's what we are doing to help:

WE RESEARCH, DEVELOP AND MARKET ANTIBIOTICS THAT TARGET DISEASE IN A RANGE OF ANIMALS, INCLUDING CATTLE, PIGS AND POULTRY.

Whether the antibiotic is given by syringe or added to feed or water, our medicines have U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved uses for the treatment and prevention of specific diseases. Our research is focused on new therapeutic options and delivery systems, such as single-dose medicines, that help to ensure dosing compliance to further minimize the development of antibiotic resistance.

WE WORK TO EDUCATE OUR CUSTOMERS ON THE PROPER USE OF OUR FDA-APPROVED MEDICINES.

Through many different programs, we work with both producers and veterinarians on the proper use of our FDA-approved medicines to restore and maintain animal health and protect the food supply. Just as in human health, using the correct antibiotic only as necessary and ensuring a full course of treatment is given to animals will help to reduce the development of resistant bacteria. Moreover, livestock producers' rigorous compliance to withholding the animal's meat and milk from the food supply until any medicine sufficiently clears the animal's system will ensure that no violative drug residues end up in meat and milk. Educating veterinarians and livestock producers is key to ensuring optimum health outcomes — and a safe food supply.

WE SUPPORT THE GOVERNMENT'S CRITICAL ROLE IN APPROVING MEDICINE USE IN ANIMALS.

We support the FDA's regulatory framework for requiring scientific testing and risk assessments to ensure that the medicines that we develop are safe for animals and people, through the food we eat. We support the government's monitoring of the resistance patterns among pathogens found on meat to serve as an early warning system. We support the government's routine testing of potential drug residues in meat and milk and the process to fine violators. And we support the FDA's policy of eliminating the use of medically important antibiotics for promoting growth in animals.

Everyone has a role to play in protecting the efficacy of medicines. Farmers, ranchers, veterinarians, doctors, the government, researchers, human pharmaceutical companies and companies like Zoetis specializing in animal health all must work collaboratively to protect animal and human health.
